CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION

The SDG MEDIA CAMP is aimed at journalists, bloggers, filmmakers, and

videographers from Belarus, France, Germany, Moldova, Poland, and Ukraine who have journalistic experience (print and online media, radio, TV, film) and are interested in sustainability and human rights issues. All participants are required to have a medium for publishing their contributions.

Each participant is expected to publish a piece of journalistic material after each meeting (Moldova, Germany, Poland) – either individually or as joint cross-border research. This means that at least three media products related to the topics of the SDG MEDIA CAMP will be published per participant throughout the project. At least one of these should be a cross-border piece produced in cooperation with colleagues from the group. The trainers and mentors can assist in the preparation of these materials. Expenses incurred in connection with the cross-border research may be supported to a certain extent.

Participants must be fluent in English and have valid travel documents (passport, visa). (We will be happy to help with visa questions on an individual basis.)

The application deadline is April 14, 2024. Announcement of the selected participants until April 19, 2024.

FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

Participation in the program is free of charge.

Travel costs (economy class, arrival by train/bus if possible), accommodation in 2-, 3- and 4-bedrooms in hotels, and meals will be covered by the organizers.

Journalists are expected to participate fully in all modules, complete all practical tasks, participate intensively in the joint research, and be present every day during the Media Camps in Moldova, Germany, and Poland. Research on other topics of your choice can be undertaken in the time allotted.

For cross-border research could be provided reimbursement for travel expenses to a certain extent.
